Obituary



Dr. G.C. Jain: Our respectful homage

“Dr. G C Jain”- the very name reminds us now a teacher & surgeon of repute, a social worker, a soft spoken fatherly figure with contagious benign smile always adorning his countenance! And now for all of us it's a cruel past.

Hailing from state of Rajasthan, Dr. Jain, after his post graduation (M S) in general surgery moved to Assam and joined GMC as a Registrar under Prof. S C Jain as Asstt. Professor, though he did not move from AMC forgoing his promotion. Subsequently, he was promoted and was designated afterwards as APPG (Asstt Professor i/c Post Graduates) around 1974-75 and worked in SU IV under Late Prof. J. Dutta.

Contribution of Jain Sir towards the formation of ASA and holding of ASICON 1978 in Guwahati, for the first time in entire North Eastern region of India, is unforgettable. Working very hard with late Prof. G. P. Sarma & other surgeon colleagues of Assam, Association of Surgeons of Assam was formed in 1990 and Dr Sarma & Dr Jain became the founder President & Honorary Secretary respectively and continued till 1991. Later on he led the association as President(now termed as Chairman) in 1996. He was also the main architect of the constitution of ASA. But long before mooted the idea of formation of an organisation of the surgeons of the state, surgeons of the state under the leadership of one of the doyens of surgeons of North East Late Prof. J. Mahanta, dared to invite ASICON (the Annual Conference of Association of Surgeons of India) to Assam way back in 1978 and it was held at Gauhati Medical College, despite limited infrastructure ! Jain Sir as Organizing Secretary worked hard round the clock along with his other colleagues and students of the Gauhati Medical College for its success. In 1990, the 1st Annual Conference of ASA was successfully held at Guwahati, under the leadership of Dr G P Sarma and Dr Jain as the Organizing Chairman & Organising Secretary respectively.

Surgi Quiz in annual Conference of ASA is the brain child of Jain Sir and for more than a decade, he designed and conducted it as the Quiz master making it an attractive and much sought after program of the conference. He used to attend the annual conferences of Association of Surgeons of India regularly and thereby gathered vast knowledge and experience as how to run an association, which in turn, helped a lot in smooth running of ASA. In case of any organisational issue or problem, our office bearers would always look up to him for valuable guidance. He represented the state chapter in the central committee of ASI as Governing Council member (now termed as Executive Council) for several terms consecutively. He had great love for our association and made it a point to attend every year except when he was out of state or indisposed. His very presence was great inspiration for the members !

“Dr. G. P. Sarma Oration”, instituted in memory of Late Prof. Sarma, by Association of Surgeons of Assam (ASA) was initially used to be delivered by chosen reputed surgeons and Jain Sir presented this prestigious oration in the annual conference held at Itanagar in 1997. Besides professional bodies, he was also closely associated with Lions Club and many other religious and social organisations and enriched them with his tremendous contribution.

In recognition of his enormous contribution to the society as a reputed surgeon, as an academician, as a social activist and mostly towards the formation of ASA, the state chapter rightfully conferred on him the **Life Time Achievement Award** in the silver jubilee annual conference of ASA in 2014 held at Guwahati.

Even after his retirement from service at Medical College, Sir continued rendering his professional service to the ailing & needy members of the society till recently before bowing to his present illness.

We pay our respectful homage to this great teacher and guide who left us on 5th January, 2020!

ACTIVITIES OF DIFFERENT BRANCHES

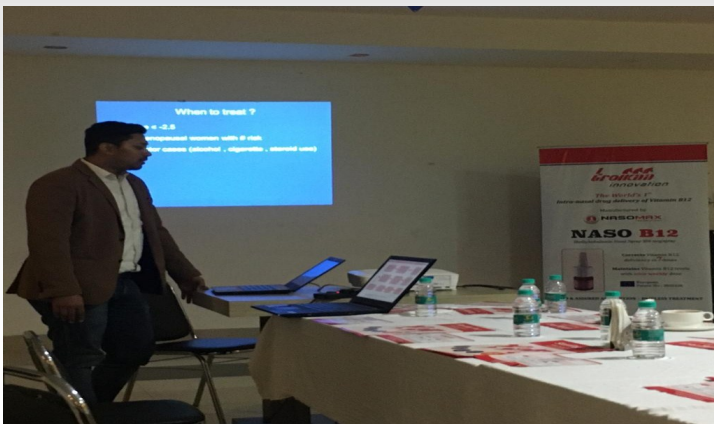

3. **Liver Transplant: Current Strategies and Outcome by Dr. Hirak Pahari, Medica Superspeciality Hospital, Kolkata.**

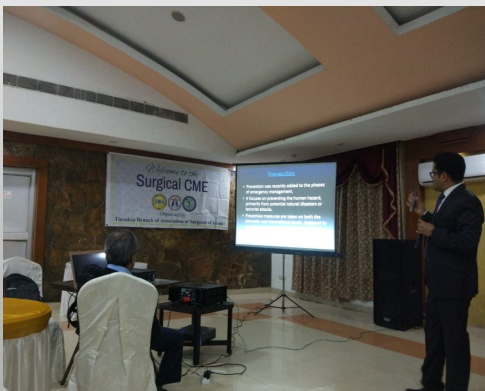
ACTIVITIES OF TINSUKIA BRANCH
